At our February 2nd Meeting, a demonstration of the Marquetry knife-cutting technique was given by Larry Fenlon.

The outdoor scene that Larry began this demonstration with is the same one that he continued to work on at our booth at “The Wood Working Show” a few weeks later.

What is great about watching a demonstration, whether you are an expert or a beginner, you can always learn something new. I enjoy observing what materials the demonstrators bring with them. You can always pick up some new tips or tricks about a variety of things such as: tools and blades used; which veneers are preferred and how they are selected; how patterns are modified;

cutting techniques; knife sharpness and sharpening methods; etc. And, you can also get a sense of how workspaces can be set up, such as lighting and eyewear used and how tools are stored and kept handy. Remember that there is no right or wrong way. Do what works for you. Enjoy your craft! □







Walter England brought in three items that he made: an Intarsia beagle; a scroll saw framed dog; and a candle holder.




